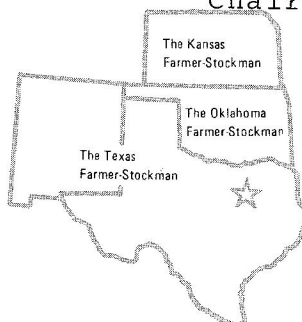
Dear Mr. Deering:
