WHAT'S the score? That depends on what you're talking about.

Businessmen keep score on raw materials available, costs, productivity, inventories, markets and prices. So de vil men, farmers, labor unions and consumer activists. Bankers keep score on your deposits, loans and withdrawals.

But who keeps score on the three dozen shooting wars now going on in the world? We keep tabs in the war on poverty, in the war on inflation, and in the war against high taxes, but not on shooting wars where nations are "playing" for regional or world championships.

World powers, of course, include

World powers, of course, include the United States, the Soviet Union, China, Japan, West Germany, a combination of European nations, and some of their allies. In keeping score, we ought to have goals identified, economic resources, population and military might measured by the same standards. This would not be easy.

Central American and African nations ought to be classified as minor league for war purposes. However, points should be scored when big league nations recruit an ally for communism or for freedom. Overthrow of totalitarian government should count big.

If a peace conference were held between warring nations, each should receive, say, 1,000 points. If the peace conference accomplished anything worth mentioning, make that 10,000 points.

If the war resulted in freedom for the winners score 10,000 points. If the winners turned out to be losers or if the winners have to subsidize and feed the losers, subtract 5,000

A nation that starts an unscheduled war, such as invading a neighboring country, should be fined and suspended. Civil war and terrorism should count against the place where it occurs.

If somebody would devise a "World War Scoreboard" with flashing lights and firecreackers maybe we would become less concerned with imaginary star wars and pay more attention to the numerous bloody conflicts now going on here
