The World Government Movement

THE recent report by the Census Bureau that the world registered its biggest 12-month population increase in history last year is significant beyond the bare statistics. It relates to a multi-phased movement to establish world government.

Only about one-third of the world's population is classified as "free." Another one-tifth is "partly free." The biggest bloc is the "not free" sector, including China and the Soviet Union.

There is a bloc of nations called the "Third World" that is seeking dominance of a sort by demanding equality with productive nations without earning 12.

The mysterious and controversial Trilateral Commission has been accused of trying to overthrow the United States Constitution and institute world government. The communists want world control.

There is a New York-based group that develops "global education" curricula which have been adopted in a number of school systems. These programs seem to go beyond teaching geography and literature to inject "a world perspective" into the classrooms.

A World Wildlife Fund whose symbol is a cuddly panda is trying to unite nature lovers. A rival organization is called the International Union for the Conservation of Nature. The Global Tomorrow Coalition was formed in 1981 to combine environmental organizations into a planetary movement. U.S. banks advertise "global electronic banking." Numerous industries are multinational.

The proposal for a Law of the Sea treaty would give sovereignty over two-thirds of the earth's surface — the oceans — to an international body "dominated by radical Third World regimes and the Soviet blee," according to Rep. Jack Fields (R-Texas).

Currently appearing in leading national magazines is a full-page advertisement inserted by The World Government of the Age of Enlightenment, offering to solve world problems.

The ad describes this World Gov-

ernment as "a non-political, non-religious, global organization with the participation of the peoples of more than 100 countries." It is based in Switzerland.

About three months ago a reader suggested to Billy Graham that "the solution to our problems eventually must be a single government that rules the world." Graham responded: "The Bible suggests that this might happen some day, when the anti-Christ comes to deceive the people and cause them to turn against God."

Significance of increasing world population to the world government movement is tremendous. The United States of America would be outvoted on every issue. The "have nots" could take away both our products and our productivity. We could lose our freedom.

In his first inaugural address (1801) President Thomas Jefferson proposed "peace, commerce and honest friendship with all nations — Entangling alliances with none." He didn't tell us how to get out of entangling alliances once we're in them.
