Ferdie served as Editor of the Farmer-Stockman magazine for thirty years. During that time, the magazine reached an all time high circulation of 435,000! Ferdie was contributing regularly to the news and editorial columns of the Daily Oklahoman. He also served as a member of the Board of Directors and the OPUBCO Management Committee.

Ferdie retired in 1975 and was honored as a Distinguished Alumnus of East Central University. He also received the Reuben Brigham Award of Agricultural Communicators in Education and in 1983 received the Henry G. Bennett Distinguished Service Award. the highest honor given by Oklahoma State University.

Throughout his career, and in his retirement, Ferdie has authored an impressive collection of published books, several of which can be found in the Epworth Villa library. Titles include,"USDA, Manager of American Agriculture" (1945);"Look at Oklahoma" (1975), a bicentennial project; "From the Grassroots Up" (1980); "Work Can Be Fun" (1978); "History of Oklahoma Farm Bureau" (1981).

Ferdie's accomplishments are impressive, to say the least, but Mildred's are equally impressive. While Ferdie was away on business a great deal during the early stages of their marriage. Mildred kept
