Thanks to you and the other business leaders of Oklahoma City, the completion of our building there early next year seems assured.

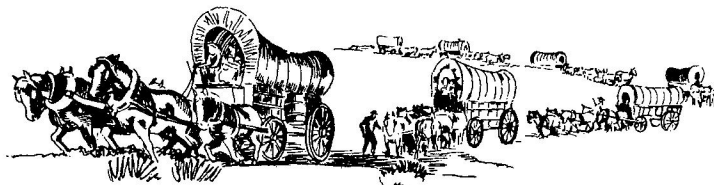

It was a pleasant surprise to hear from you again, even though in a round-about electronic fashion.

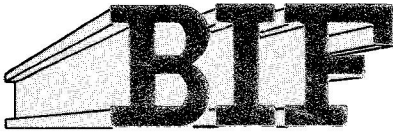
